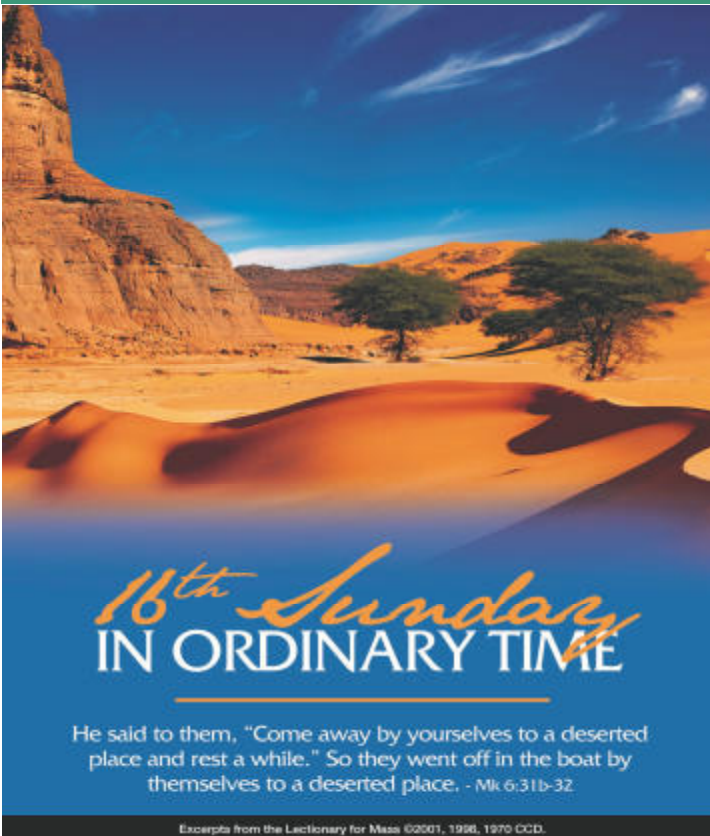
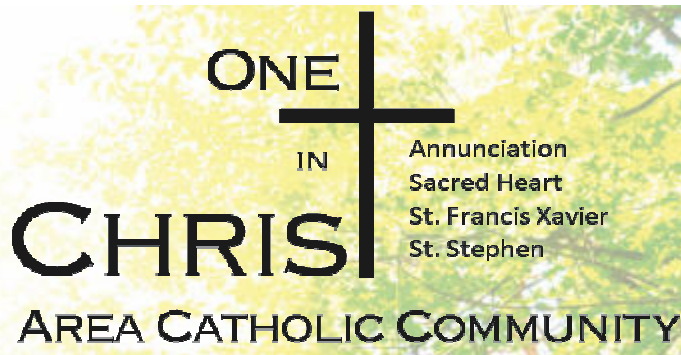

MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



From Safari.....

One of my first jobs outside the home was at the Sauk Rapids Perkins (now closed). It was open 24 hours. Being part time, I worked mostly evenings and weekends, including the weekend “bar shift” which meant heading home around 3am. Outside of the Good

Neighbor --- WCCO, there were no local radio stations on the air. I can remember searching the radio dial and tuning in WLS out of Chicago or station out of Denver or Oklahoma.

Today with the various media platforms available to us 24/7, we have countless listening and viewing options at our fingertips. The challenge is gleaning accurate information from the right or left leaning commentary.

With so many competing voices coming at us, it can be difficult to hear the voice of God. Ron Rolheiser notes, “There’s rarely a moment within our waking lives that someone or something isn’t calling out to us and—even in our sleep—dreams and nightmares ask for our attention. And each voice has its own particular cadence and message.

Some voices invite us in, promising us life if we do this or that or buy a certain product or idea; others threaten us. Some voices beckon us towards hatred, bitterness, and anger, while others challenge is towards love, graciousness, and forgiveness. Some voices tell us that they are playful and humorous, not to be taken seriously, even as others trumpet that they are urgent and weighty, the voice of non-negotiable truth, God’s voice.”

Much like the people in today’s gospel we can feel like sheep without a shepherd. With voices bombarding us constantly, how do we recognize God’s voice among and within all of these voices?

The answer is not easy. For everything that God has created is good. God speaks to us in many ways, not all of which are religious. It is also true that God does not speak to us everything that claims to be religious.

Discerning God’s voice sometimes is gut feeling. But even in those moments, it is always good to see how our gut feeling measures up against church teaching. Contrary to the claims there is no absolute truth, sure and certain truth comes to us in the scriptures and the teachings found in our tradition through the works of popes and church councils. It is important to remember that the Word of God, always calls us upward, drawing us to holiness. In this we can expect the Word of God to: invite us to live beyond our fears, challenge our comfort zone, remind us we are his precious son or daughter, affirm us and never put us down, help us acknowledge the complexities of our world and our lives, and is heard where there is authentic enjoyment and gratitude.

To hear God’s voice requires practice, practice that comes through our daily prayer. Through your spoken prayers and in the silence, may you hear the word of God speaking in your heart.

Book Discussion on Return: How to Draw Your Child Back to the Church

One of the most common concerns shared with pastors and others in ministry revolves around a question worded something like this: "My children / grandchildren don't go to church anymore. What can I do?"

Brandon Vogt's book, *Return: How to Draw Your Child Back to the Church*, does not answer that question. I appreciate that, because as the author notes humbly, there is no single or simple answer. What the book does, however, is provide some strategies to pray, to engage in respectful and sincere listening, and to invite.

If this question is on your heart, or if you want to learn more about supporting others in the journey of faith, you are invited to join in a book discussion on *Return*.

The study will run five weeks and offers two time-slots:

Mondays from 6:30-8:00 p.m. at Sacred Heart from July 19 to August 16

Thursdays from 9:00-10:30 a.m. at Annunciation from July 22 to August 19

You may attend either session depending on your schedule for each week.

The book is 225 pages, and available on Kindle for around \$7.00; used copies are around \$25; new copies have risen to \$50. Participants can share a book if they wish.

While we will recap key points from the chapters read each week, the time will largely involve conversation and sharing. It is intended both for learning and mutual support in our common work of evangelization.

YEAR OF ST JOSEPH-CREATIVE COURAGE

Pope Francis uses the phrase “creative courage” to describe Joseph’s trusting obedience. By this he means that while Joseph was presented with challenges in fulfilling his mission to protect and raise Jesus, he was not given simple and clear solutions to those challenges. He had to be resourceful, creative, courageous in engaging them to find the answers.

He offers two examples clear in the Gospels: finding no lodging in Bethlehem, and having to flee by night to Egypt. They are simple to describe but the problems they presented called for a series of decisions and steps to resolve – a place to stay, financial arrangements, food, employment. As the Pope notes, “for all the arrogance and violence of worldly powers, God always finds a way to carry out his saving plan.” And most often, this “way” involves people like us, who combine human effort with trust in divine providence.

Joseph was entrusted with the greatest treasures of our faith – the Son of God and the Mother who gave Him the human nature He would offer on the Cross. Because Jesus reveals to us: “Whatever you do to the least, you do to Me,” we too are made sharers in our place and time in the same mission Joseph accepted – to care for the Body of Christ. And like Joseph, we need the creative courage to combine human effort with trust in divine providence.

What concrete problems do you face that can benefit from St. Joseph’s intercession and his example of creative courage?

FrantoberFest 2021

Without someone to plan and organize the multiple festival events, many of our Fall festival events may not take place this year. However, the Parish Festival generates significant income for the parish budget and we plan to have the Big Ticket raffle, an online auction, and the Franny Flyer 5K/10K run this year on the weekend of Sept. 18-19.

Last year FrantoberFest generated net income of a little over \$60K, with the raffle accounting for nearly half of that, \$9K coming from the auction and \$23K from straight donations. There are great prizes to win – a cash grand prize of \$3,000 as well as gift certificates, products and additional cash prizes. Chances are \$5 each and will be distributed in the Gathering Place beginning in August. We will keep you posted on plans for the raffle drawing on Sunday, September 19, 2021 at 12pm noon.

Without all of the other events of our traditional festival, we expect to have a financial shortfall. Again this year, we ask all households to prayerfully consider making a \$100 donation to the parish festival this year. This will help with the parish budget that relies on the income from the Parish Festival. Any additional donation you can make beyond buying raffle tickets would be greatly appreciated and help our budget stay healthy.
