#### **MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES**

#### Saint Patrick's Day

Patrick was not Irish. Sometimes this fact surprises people, so associated is he with Ireland. Understanding why is a good Lenten reflection in itself.

Patrick's world of the fifth century was a time of upheaval and change with the decline of the Roman Empire and the rise of more localized power. At the same time, commonality came to be rooted in a shared Christian heritage as missionaries brought the message of the Gospel to new and growing lands.

So while nations as we know them on today's maps were more like kingdoms or local clans and alliances, we can say that Patrick was among the earliest of these missionaries. From the land that is today part of England, he was captured in one of the occasional raids that came across the sea from today's land of Ireland. What we know of his life comes largely from his own writing, the Confession of Saint Patrick.

Like St. Augustine's Confession, this is not about a confessing sins but a confession of faith, an autobiography that is not about what Patrick has done but what God did for and through him. It is a gesture of praise for God's providential care in theface of human failure and unworthiness. It is a testimony illustrating Jesus' words to St. Paul: "My grace is sufficient for you, for in weakness, power reaches perfection" (II Corinthians 12:9).

At the age of 15, he was taken as were "thousands of others" over time to Ireland. Patrick was a slave, sent to tend sheep. In this solitude, rough weather, and poverty, he turned to prayer and grew in faith and trust. That's easy to say, but imagine the strength he got to endure a life he had not chosen and which claimed many for despair and bitterness.

He was able to escape Ireland at 21 when taken by other raiders on a ship back to England. For a second time he was enslaved and then again freed and reunited with his family against all hopes. This lasted "a few short years" until he received a nighttime vision: a man from Ireland named Victor appeared to him, imploring him to return to Ireland to bring the Gospel. Soon after, another vision ended with the voice of Jesus in his mind: "The One Who gave His life for you, He it is Who is speaking to you."

After a series of other messages and trials about his own unworthiness, Patrick was ordained a bishop and returned to Ireland, the former land of his slavery. He was now among his former captors, but this time in the love of God – an outsider who did not lose his freedom but offered his presence and labor as a free gift.

The Confession was written towards the end of his life to counter slanders and accusations about his motives and his incompetence. The theme runs throughout: he admits his ignorance and lack of education (while writing in a highly learned and eloquent Latin style, with a richly complex literary structure), but uses those very weaknesses to reinforce his claim that his life and service was not his doing, but God at work through him – again to quote St. Paul, that his ministry was a treasure in earthen vessels (Il Corinthians 4:7). It begins with the assertion: "I, Patrick, am a sinner, the most uncultured and smallest among all the faithful, indeed many people consider me to be worthless."

While the world may observe St. Patrick's Day with shamrocks, leprechauns, and green beer, the Church celebrates the power of God working in unexpected ways. Patrick lived the pattern of Lent we still seek to follow: from slavery to freedom, and from freedom to service; founding our trust not on our human skills and capabilities, but on the constant presence of God's grace and mercy; answering criticism not with bitterness and anger but with humility and witness to what Jesus does in our own lives; with a deep sense of answering a call that is at times pleasant and at times painful; and to be grateful every day for how God is at work.

The final words inspire us 15 centuries later, knowing that we share the same faith and the same Eucharist: "I beg of those who believe in God ... do not credit me with the little I have done according to God's pleasure. Rather conclude, as is indeed true, that anything I achieved was a gift of God/ This is my Confession before I die."




