

Hello!! May the peace of Christ be with one and all!! My name is Terry Jancik and while those at Sacred Heart in Sauk Rapids are familiar with my journey, I have been invited to share a little of my story with the

rest of our ACC.

I am a newly ordained Permanent Deacon of the Saint Cloud Diocese as of this weekend and I look forward to meeting all of you as our parishes come together to form our Area Catholic Community.

I have been married to my wife Barb for over 32 years and together we have 5 beautiful children (Abby, who started her life together with her husband Jake in 2017, Michael who will be starting a new life with his fiancée Stephanie in December of 2021, Eric, Theresa and Isaiah) and 1 beautiful grandchild Norah who is Jake and Abby's daughter. Our family has been members of Sacred Heart parish since shortly after we moved to Sauk Rapids in 1994.

As a young man I was inspired by and greatly admired the Priests that would frequently visit our home. I thought very deeply at that time of becoming a Priest. But as I grew older, I knew that God was calling me to be both a husband and a father. So, I put my vocational calling on a shelf but God was not done calling me.

I was approached by Deacon Joe Kresky after Mass one Saturday night around 2012 and was asked if I had ever considered becoming a Deacon. That is when I really began to discern my calling to the Permanent Diaconate and began asking other people (whose opinions I respected) if they saw the gifts in me to be a good Deacon and the answer was always "Yes".

I applied and was accepted into the program on January 17th, 2020. Three days before I turned 50. The BEST birthday present ever!! I started classes that following fall at Saint John's and completed the necessary coursework in May.

I am looking forward to meeting all of you and serving the parishes of our ACC with great passion and humility.

Greetings to all! It is great to be back in my office preparing once again for a new year of ministry. Can it really be the middle of August?

No one can deny that this Year of the Lord, 2020 is unprecedented! We as a people have never in our lives experienced living in a global pandemic; the closing of our schools, our churches, nursing and assisted living facilities, businesses and in many cases, being required to work remotely from our homes while becoming full-time educators to our children. For our safety and that of others we are told to distance ourselves, wear masks and restrict our gatherings. We long for things to "get back to normal" while at the same time knowing that we most likely will need to adjust to a "new normal" as our lives have changed in so many ways.

For many this causes great concern; increased stress, fear, confusion, anxiety, worry. We long for security and peace of mind. We might identify with the woman in today's Gospel who was desperately seeking the attention of Jesus – she was asking for healing for her daughter who was tormented by a demon. The word "tormented" might well describe how we feel in these uncertain times. The disciples petitioned Jesus to send this woman away, her persistent calls to Jesus seemed to annoy them. But she was determined as she approached Jesus, did him homage and pleaded, "Lord, have pity on me, help me!" Jesus recognizes her sincerity and responds:

*O woman, great is your faith!
Let it be done to you as you wish.
Matthew 15.25,28*

And from that hour, the woman's daughter was healed. The woman in Matthew's gospel deeply believed in Jesus – her faith gave her the strength to seek help from the one she knew in her heart could restore her daughter to peace of mind. We can only imagine that this healing affected the lives of everyone who loved her and her daughter. Faith in Jesus brought them an opportunity for renewed life and hope in their future.

Jesus is our hope in troubled times. Our faith in him will see us through this pandemic and will bless us beyond our imagining. Only when we surrender our lives to Jesus will we find the peace and comfort we seek. Oh, we will experience difficulties again in life, but those too, we will navigate with sure and certain hope that God is and will continue to be with us.

Let us this week thank God for the gift of our faith in Jesus Christ and let us pray for those who struggle to believe. In this way we can contribute to the mission of our Church – to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world.
