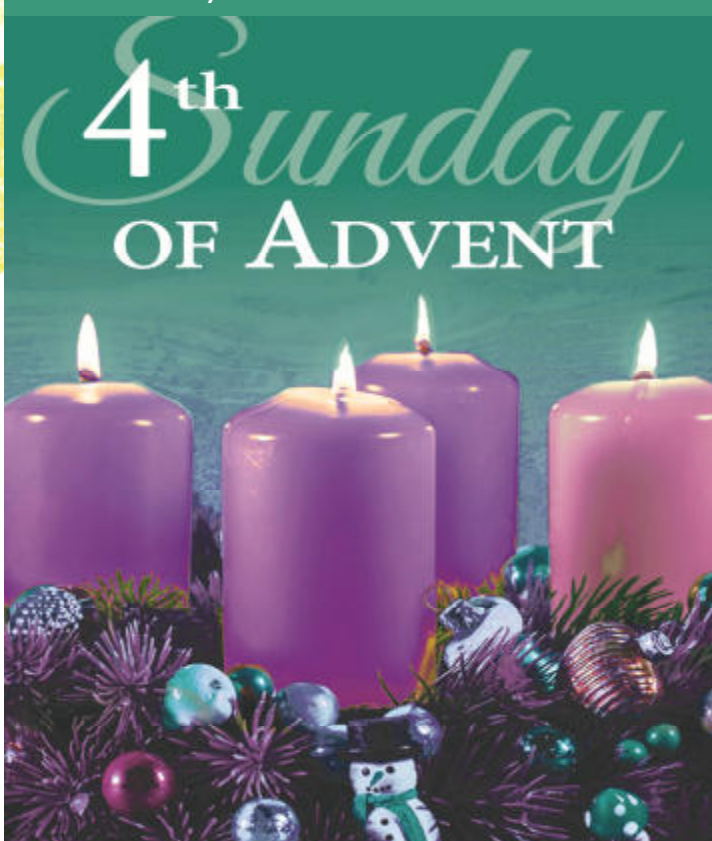

MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



This year's Advent Season is drawing to a close and we are preparing to celebrate Christmas – the Birth of Jesus. Shortly thereafter, we will celebrate the New Year's Holiday. Honestly, I haven't met a person who isn't ready to put 2020 behind us and embrace 2021 with the hope of a better year. But not so fast!

There have certainly been many challenges for us to overcome in this year: Covid-19, social distancing, health of loved ones, economic challenges, stay-at-home orders, inability to gather for events (such as graduations, weddings, funerals, reunions, etc.), riots, and looting just to name a few. However, if we all take a moment to reflect on this past year, I would certainly hope that each of us could find a few positive moments to embrace.

My fear is that we are so anxious to get this year behind us that we forget to pause and give thanks for this season that we are currently celebrating in our faith journey. For many of us, hope has gotten us through the difficult moments during this past year. Hope has helped us through past challenges in our lives and hope will help us through future challenges.

As Christians, some could argue that hope was born when Jesus became Man. When the angel came to Mary and told her that God had chosen her to be the mother of our Savior, she knew she had the awesome responsibility to bring hope into this world. She knew it would not be easy. She knew that God was asking her to assume this amazing responsibility. She knew that she was being called to give birth to God's only Son for our salvation. But she probably didn't know exactly how difficult this would actually be for her.

From the beginning of Jesus' life to His death, it must have been agonizing for Mary to witness the pain and suffering her son would endure. We'll discuss His suffering and death on the cross in a few months during the Lent and Easter seasons; but for now, let's focus on the difficulties that took place at the beginning of His life.

Imagine the Son of God being born and there was no place for him to lay but in a manger. Imagine that King Herod was trying to end His life before it began. Imagine the fear and uncertainty that must have been going through Mary and Joseph's minds in those days surrounding His birth. Yet hope for a better tomorrow carried them through this uncertain time.

We don't know what challenges are ahead for any of us, but hope will get us through those difficult times. My Christmas wish for all of you is that even in the midst of this pandemic-filled time in our lives, we can pause and see the beauty and hope that was born in Christ and through Christ. For God so loved the world that He sent His only Son! (c.f. John 3:16).

STAINED GLASS

Next time you are in church, make sure you check all the
dormers. At the beginning of this year, there was only one
of four installed. As funds came in to put in the Sacred
Heart window, we were also able to put in a dormer at
the same time. This was right around Easter. At that time
Gary TerHaar, the artist who designed our stained-glass
windows, talked about his retirement and the hope that he
would be able to finish the windows in our building.

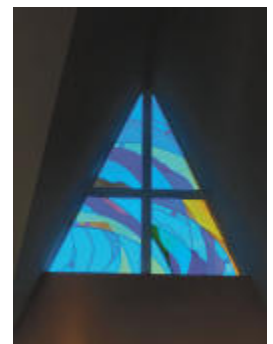
About a week ago, a parishioner contacted me and was
interested in making a year-end gift that would allow us to
complete one of the dormers. I called Gary and let him
know that we were ready to have another dormer
installed. He happily told me that the windows were built
when the last dormer was put together and they would be
here within a week to install.

Wednesday morning after Mass, they started setting up
their scaffolding and had one window installed by
10:30am. I stopped in and realized that they brought both
windows with them. I considered this a happy accident and
let them proceed with the installation of both dormers. The
donor I mentioned earlier was particularly interested in
having the dormer on the AV side installed, so I am now
considering the east dormer on the pond side of church our
Serendipity Window. Gary can now retire knowing our
building is complete, and we have all our stained-glass
windows in before Christmas.
