


Relief for Haiti Collection:

MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



Join Us to Meet, Connect, and Grow – September 12, 1-4 p.m.

“Why can I not do what these people have done?”

As I write this, the Church observes the memorial of Augustine, the great bishop, theologian, and Saint from the 4th-5th centuries. The quote comes from his *Confessions*, a book-length account of his gratitude to God from the work of divine mercy in his life. Augustine tells how patiently, gently, and personally, God led him from a life of worldly success but with a restless heart to the peace of accepting the Lord’s healing grace.

Augustine was teetering between the comfort and pleasures of his familiar life and the adventure of setting out to follow Jesus. As he considered the lives of the Apostles and saints, and the faithfulness of his own mother Monica, he wrote those words: “Why can I not do what these people have done?” Though he had not yet surrendered to God’s grace, the question itself shows that already his values and priorities were changing. Conversion was underway and his restless heart was being drawn.

Fr. Ron and I – along with the ACC Evangelization and Stewardship Committees – warmly invite you to Sacred Heart on Sunday, September 12 from 1-4 p.m. to Meet, Connect, and Grow. It is open to all who are interested, and especially for the leadership councils, committees, and staff of all of our ACC parishes. What is this all about?

Four ACC goals were established with your previous pastors and the ACC Planning Council. For two of them, the outcomes are more concrete. The Mass schedule was crafted; a Young Adult Ministry coordinator has been hired (welcome, Jason Prigge!); some of our sacramental preparation and the RCIA program is being done collaboratively.

The other two goals are perpetually ongoing in every parish: Evangelization, to deepen our personal friendship with Jesus Christ and introduce others to Him; and Stewardship, to live as missionary disciples with consistency and integrity in every aspect of our lives.

With COVID, the efforts were redirected to formation and education in what we mean by evangelization and stewardship, and research into best practices. Above all, we wanted people to understand that these two are closely interwoven – to share and to live the Gospel of Jesus – ***and that they are already happening in many inspiring ways.***

The goals of the Meet, Connect, and Grow event are:

- to deepen our learning together about ***Evangelization and Stewardship***
- to recognize, affirm, and celebrate the ways people and parishes are already achieving the mission of evangelizing and being good stewards of God’s gifts

- to plan for our future: we need your insights to brainstorm what next concrete steps we can take together to grow as missionary disciples in service of Jesus’ message of hope, mercy, and grace in our lives and in those we are sent to serve

Bring an item for the Food Shelf; bring your ideas; bring your experiences and what has inspired you in the past; bring your faith and creativity.

Back to St. Augustine. Among his most iconic words come from his own lived experience of being evangelized and entrusted with gifts to use for God and not merely his own advantage in life: “You have made us for yourself, O Lord; and our hearts are restless until they rest in You.” Like so many of the saints, he received the Gospel after a struggle; he lived the Gospel with awe and daily gratitude; he shared the Gospel and we learn from him even today.

We can do what those people have done. You can help us figure out how.

The Area Catholic Community of Mayhew Lake, Sauk Rapids, Sartell, St. Francis Xavier The purpose of the ACC is to respond to the call of Jesus to be missionary disciples. We strive to strengthen parish life by working together to share our resources, talents, and efforts in providing for the pastoral and spiritual needs of all.

Updates for the One in Christ ACC Planning Council meeting held August 3, 2021 at St. Francis Xavier.

The Council clarified that the date for the upcoming Stewardship & Evangelization event is September 12, 2021 and that Frank Rajkowski's position on the ACC would be taken by a current member of the SFX Parish Council. The Council welcomed new members Marie Pangerl from St. Stephen and Tom Offerdahl from SFX.

The Council discussed membership transitions after the current members three-year terms expire and the necessity that future terms be staggered to ensure continuity. It was agreed that terms would expire on January 1 each year.

Discussion then turned to the Planning Council's role in reviewing goals and in developing new goals concerning different areas of parish life. The possibility of a Mission for the entire ACC is being explored.

Committees:

Stewardship & Evangelization Committees Joan Krause will attend a national stewardship conference in Wichita, Kansas this month. Additional members are needed for the stewardship committee. The Stewardship/Evangelization event, Meet, Connect, and Grow is scheduled for September 12, 1:00-4:00 at Sacred Heart Parish.

Young Adult Committee Young Adult Coordinator Jason Prigge has been hired. The council talked about his role and the need for the council and parishes to assist him.

Worship Committee The schedule of Masses was again discussed. The reliance on retired priests is not going to be a permanent solution. It was acknowledged that there needs to be better communication on this and other topics. Finally, it was agreed that each parish was responsible for paying the substitute priests at that parish, with the goal of sharing costs equitably.

The next meeting of the Council will be on September 7, 2021 at 7 P.M. in St. Stephen.


