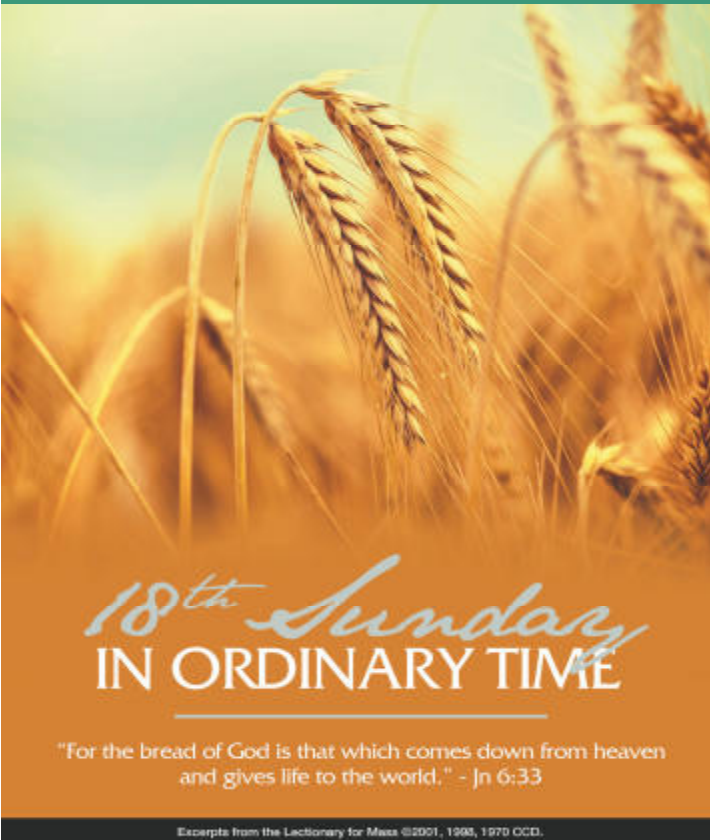

MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



"Imagine there's no countries.
It isn't hard to do
Nothing to kill or die for
And no religion, too
Imagine all the people
Livin' life in peace You"

These words, from the 1971 song "Imagine", penned by John Lennon and Yoko Uno, was sung as part of the opening ceremony of summer Olympics in Tokyo. (The song has appeared in at least four other Olympics.) It is easy to see why the song has been included, the games themselves strive to reach for this utopian ideal of world unity and harmony. Athletes from across the globe gather to prove their skill against others in various sports, often next to athletes from their enemy. This year individuals from 206 jurisdictions will complete in 33 different sports.

John Lennon and Yoko Uno's utopian dream while admirable, is wrong to eliminate religion. People acting in the name of religion, have brought conflict into the world. In our time, many terrorists have hidden behind Islam for their acts of violence. Religion is important to our existence. From earliest times, humans turned to gods --- for rain, to cure illness, for protection from storms. Only through faith can one navigate the mysteries of life, death, natural disasters, terminal illness, to name a few. In fact, without the ability to live eternally, everyday life would become useless and hopeless. Prayer and meditation are key prerequisites for moving forward in the inner life, for the avoidance of floundering and confusion. "Without this one hour a day for God," wrote Fr. Henri Nouwen, "my life loses its coherency and I start experiencing my days as a series of random incidents and accidents."

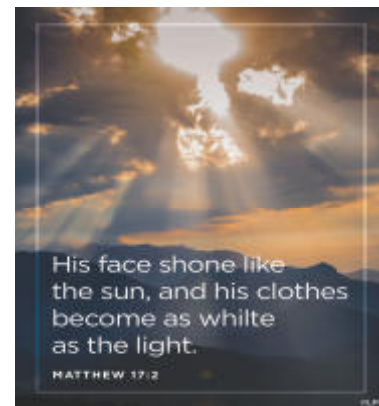
The message of world unity is at the heart of Jesus' message the Kingdom of God is at hand. Jesus preaches a place where all are our brothers and sisters, despite different skin color, ideologies, and beliefs. Jesus, as William Bausch has explained, was engaging in what is called "consciousness raising" (Once Upon a Gospel, Twenty-Third Publications, Mystic, CT, 2008). He encouraged people to move from one level to another, to see beyond and behind, to see as he himself sees. Jesus could see beyond the demands of the crowds for another free lunch and recognize the deeper hungers of which they had yet to become aware. He could see beyond the beggar to the blessedness God has bestowed on every creature. Jesus could look beyond the shamed adulterer and acknowledge the repentant sinner. Jesus could look beyond the betrayals and denials of his disciples and see in them the wounded beggars who would thereafter help others to find the bread of his word, of his wisdom, of his very self. Jesus could see beyond skin color, gender, politics and socioeconomic status and recognize his brothers and sisters. Some of the saints among us have shown a similar ability to see beyond. Mother Teresa, for example, could look beyond the filth of India's poor and recognize in them the face of Jesus. Mohandas Gandhi and John Paul II could look into the faces of their would-be assassins and recognize a brother whom they could forgive.

Our reception of Jesus' body and blood, only makes sense if we look beyond and to see where the sign is pointing. World unity begins with our actions and thoughts in our circles of influence.

The purpose of the ACC is to respond to the call of Jesus to be missionary disciples.

We strive to strengthen parish life by working together to share our resources, talents, and efforts in providing for the pastoral and spiritual needs of all.

Updates for the One in Christ ACC Planning Council meeting held June 1, 2021 at Sacred Heart Committees:

- **Stewardship & Evangelization Committees** The two committees are looking at ways they can collaborate. They proposed an ACC gathering tentatively set for September 19, 2021. This event would include Planning Council members, Parish Council and Finance Council members, Parish Staff, other parish leadership groups and anyone else who is interested. The purpose of the event would be to meet others in the ACC, to broaden the understanding of these concepts as studied by the committees, and to , begin visioning how each parish can move forward. Refreshments and door prizes will be included.
- **Young Adult Committee** Some frustration was expressed in regard to the Young Adult committee goal of hiring a young adult co-ordinator for all parishes and not just Sacred Heart. The concern was that this had been a goal proposed by the Planning Council, but its ability to effectuate that has been limited. Jason Prigge has been hired for this position and does intend to work with the entire ACC to develop this ministry.
- **Worship Committee** The new Mass schedule was implemented July 3/4. With the help of some retired priests there will be 3 Saturday evening and 4 Sunday morning Masses. The schedule will be reviewed throughout the year

The proposed Articles of Organization and ByLaws were reviewed, updated and approved with recommended changes. They can be viewed on the ACC website. Further discussion took place concerning member qualifications, the need to stagger terms, and the number of members needed from each parish. It was noted that the requirement that one member from each parish be an active member of that parish's Pastoral Council would require a new member from SFX. **Marie Pangerl from St. Stephen has agreed to take Carol's place on the ACC.**

The Planning Council will work on a transition plan during the coming year including a way to stagger members' terms.

The next meeting will take place on August 3, 2021 at 7pm at SFX.

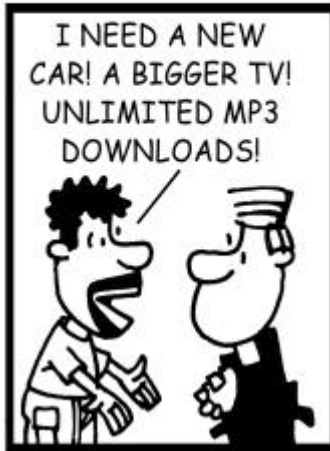
